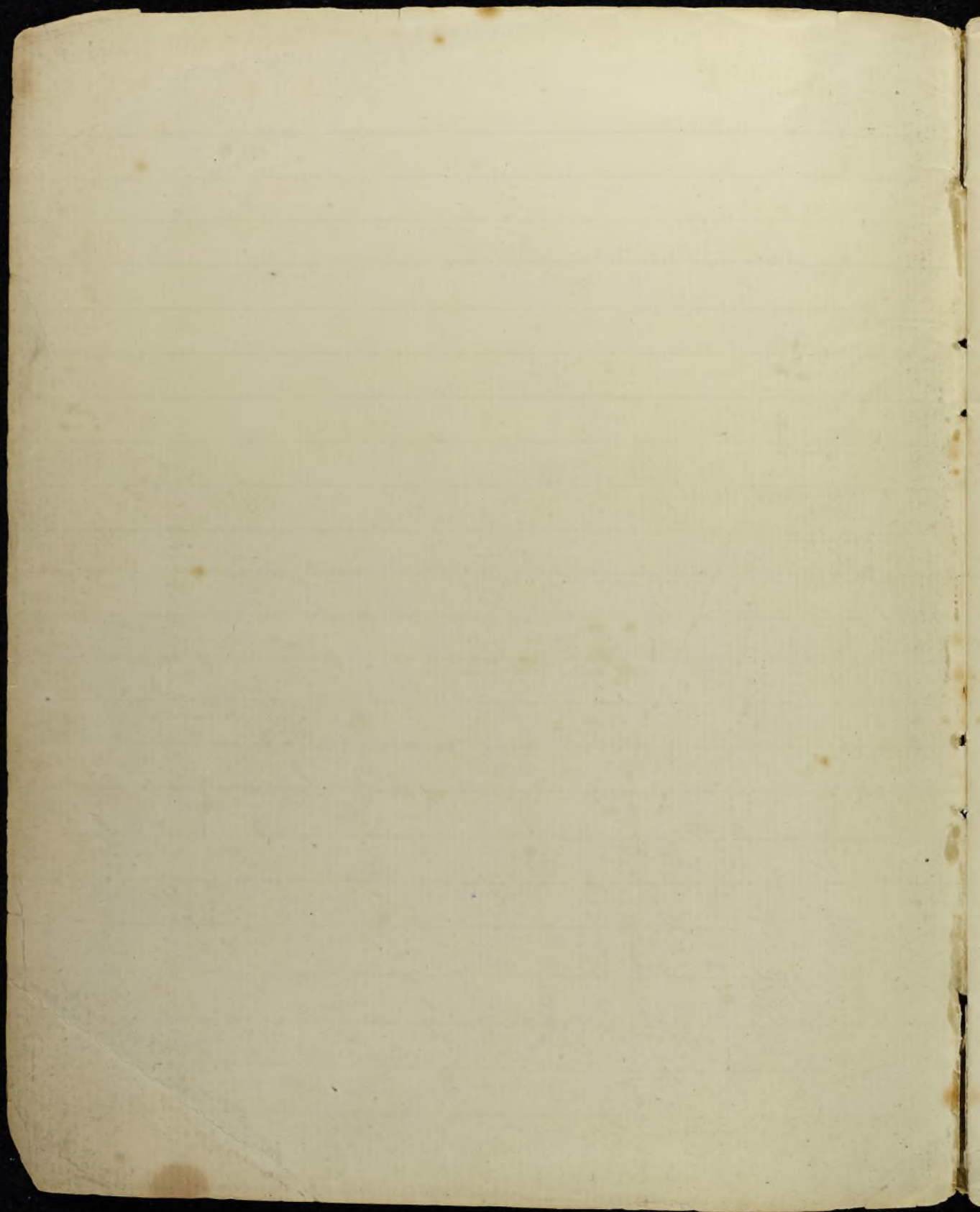

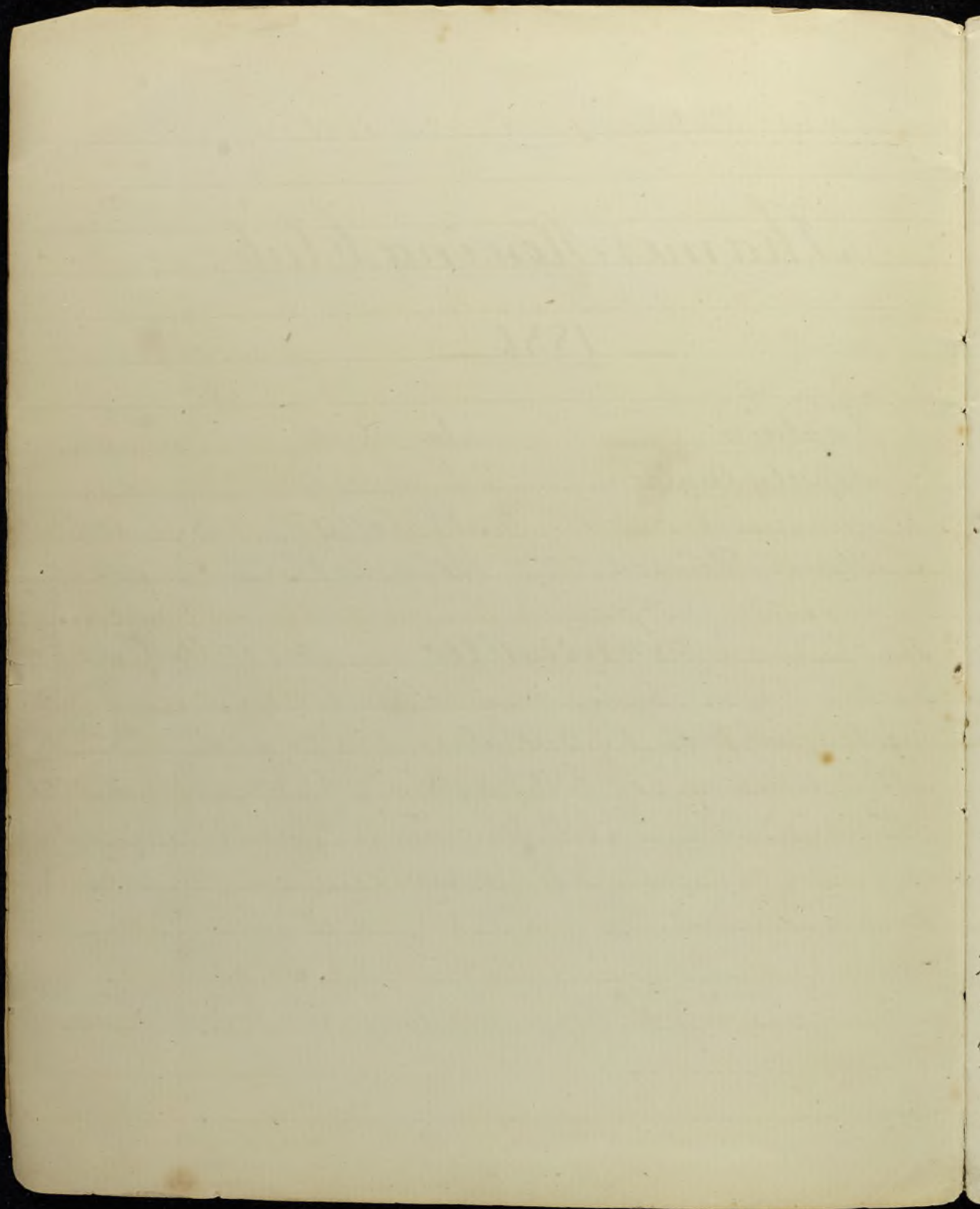

I.—That this Club be called the "THAMES ROWING CLUB"; the number of Members unlimited, and the rates of subscriptions as follows:—

ACTIVE MEMBERS:—

Two guineas per annum, and a guinea and a half entrance fee, except for Members elected prior to September 1st, 1871, whose subscriptions shall remain twenty-five shillings.

"Thames R.C.": Rules passed at the
Meeting held May 26th 1883.

The subscriptions of Members elected after the 1st of September, in any year, to be placed to their credit for the ensuing year.

* Life Members, twelve guineas on election, or seven guineas after payment of five annual subscriptions.

HONORARY MEMBERS:—

† Members elected before January 1st, 1873, 25s. per annum.

† Members elected before September 1st, 1879, 30s. per annum.

Life Members, seven guineas on election, or five guineas for Members as elected above.

* Except for Members holding not less than five shares in the Thames Boat House Company, who shall be eligible to take up their Life-membership for six guineas after payment of Five Annual Subscriptions.

† Provided they claimed this privilege in 1881.

2.—That the colours of the Club be red, white, and black, and that the Members wear the Club cap (or hat), and trimmed jersey when rowing in Club Crews.

3.—That the management of the Club be vested in a committee of sixteen Members, including the Captain, Deputy-Captain, Secretary, Treasurers, and House-Steward; that they be elected by the Members at the Annual General Meeting, and that five form a quorum.

4.—That power be given to the Committee to make regulations and bye-laws having the force of rules, and to alter or suspend any rule which may be found to work badly; and that the same be confirmed or annulled at the next meeting of the Club.

5.—That a meeting of the Members, called by the Secretary, be held on or

about the last Saturday in each month, which meeting, if consisting of not less than eleven Members, shall have full power to deal with any question brought before it, due notice of which shall have been given by the Secretary. A special General Meeting may be convened by the Secretary at any time, either at the choice of the Committee or at the request in writing of not less than ten Members.

6.—That notice in writing of any question to be submitted to the Club meetings be sent to the Secretary before the 20th of each month, and published in the next Club Circular.

7.—That the names, addresses, and profession of all gentlemen proposed for election, and the names of their proposers and seconders, be published in a Club Circular, and sent to every Member of the Club. The election (by ballot, one black ball in

five to exclude) to take place at the next meeting, and the Entrance Fee and first year's Subscription of the New Member to be guaranteed by his proposer.

8.—That it shall be necessary for election to the Club that the proposer or seconder of the Candidate be present at the Election.

9.—That the present Members of the Club pay their subscriptions on or before the 1st of March; and that no Member shall be entitled to the use of the Club Boats, or be eligible to enter for any Club race or represent the Club in any Regatta crew, unless he has paid his subscription and all liabilities to the Club.—New Members to pay within a month of their election.

10.—That Members going abroad for more than one year, or Members residing

50 miles from London, providing they be absent for one whole year, (from London,) be exempt from paying any subscriptions during their absence, providing such exemption be claimed on or before the 1st March.

11.—That any Member wishing to resign shall give notice thereof to the Secretary, in writing, before the 1st of March, failing which he will be liable for his subscription for the ensuing season.

12.—That a list of those Members whose subscriptions for the current season are unpaid on the 1st of June shall be posted in the Club Room, and that those Members whose subscriptions are unpaid on the 1st of November, or whose other liabilities to the Club of any kind whatsoever remain unpaid after three months of their being contracted, shall be considered as defaulters, their names shall be read at the

Annual General Meeting and published in the Annual Report, and they shall cease to be Members of the Club.

13.—That all subscriptions and other monies due from Members and other persons in regard to the Club matters shall be personal debts to the Secretary of the Club for the time being, who shall hold the same in trust for the Treasurers, and that the Committee shall have power to allow to such Secretary all legal and other expenses he may incur in recovering (or attempting to recover) the same, which shall be repaid out of the funds of the Club.

14.—That the Captain, or, in his absence, the Deputy-Captain, or in the absence of both, the senior Member of the Committee present, shall have entire control over the crews and boats, shall act as referee, and his decision shall in all cases be final.

16.—That no Club Race be started without an umpire.

17.—That no boats be hired at the expense of the Club without the permission of the Captain or his representative.

18.—That all boats be returned to the Boat-house the same evening, unless with the special permission of the Captain or his representative.

19.—That in the event of injury to any boat, the Crew shall be held liable to make good the damage, unless the Committee consider the expense should be borne by the Club.

20.—That except for the necessary business of the Club, or for the purpose of entry at any Athletic Competition, no Member shall publish his name, or permit it to be published—as a Member of the Club—in any public print, without the previous authorization of the Committee. Any Member infringing this Rule shall be liable to expulsion under Rule 23.

21.—That the entry at Regattas of all Four and Eight-oared Crews shall be made, and the Entrance Fee forwarded, by the Secretary only.

22.—That the Club House be closed at 1 a.m. throughout the year, except on special occasions for which the permission of the Committee has been obtained.

23.—That any Member wilfully infringing the Club Rules, Bye laws, or Regula-
